Last month it was reported in this newspaper that the home improvement store Menard's would be building a store in Avon on Chester Road very close to Lowe's. It also was reported that Levin Furniture would constructing a new store off Nagel Road at the Interstate The former Ethan Allen furniture store location at Avon Commons continues to sit empty. Soon Levin Furniture will be moving from the Commons to a new building near the Interstate 90 interchange on Nagel Road, leaving two large empty storefronts.

Volleyball facility proposed: Not to be outdone by baseball, football and soccer, volleyball players in the area may soon have their own facility if a proposal to build an indoor volleyball complex is approved by city officials in Avon.

Tony Tahan, owner and director of **Spirit Volleyball Club** (SVC), recently presented plans during a city council work session to construct an approximately 20,000-square-foot building that would include courts, as well as a snack/dining area. The facility would be built on Recreation Lane near the French Creek YMCA and All Pro Freight Stadium.

Founded in 2001, SVC is currently based in Elyria. The goal is to have a permanent building rather than lease/rent space.

There are currently 38 teams at the facility with players from local middle and high schools participating.

Tahan is the head volleyball coach at Columbia High School and has previously coached volleyball at By Village High School. He has also coached soccer in the area.

Also still in the works for the proposed area is the construction of **Bo Jackson's Elite Sports training facility**. The \$6 million domed multi-sport training facility was approved by city council approved back in October 2013. According to city officials, the project is still active but no updated timeline for construction has been presented.

Music and ice cream: The annual Band A La Mode concert will take place Feb. 28 from noon - 5 p.m. at Avon High School. Specific band times are as follows: noon - 5th grade band; 12:35 p.m. - 8th grade band; 1:10 p.m. - 6th grade band; 1:45 p.m. - 7th grade band; 2:20 p.m. - high school jazz band; 2:55 p.m. - high school symphonic band; 3:30 p.m. - middle school jazz band; 4:05 p.m. - high School wind ensemble and 4:40 p.m. indoor drum line (main gym).

Admission is \$5 for adults and children 6 and older. Adults 60 and over and military veterans are \$3. Children 5 and younger are free.

All aboard: The Waugaman Gallery at the Avon Lake Public Library will be transformed into a model railroad complete with scenery and working trains Feb. 28 from 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. and March 1 from 1 - 4 p.m. Members of the National Model Railroad Association MCR Division 4 will be on hand to share their hobby. All ages are welcome to attend.

Tax assistance: The Regional Income Tax Agency (RITA) invites all taxpayers who are required to file a municipal income tax return for any RITA municipality to attend a free Taxpayer Assistance event on March 3 from 1- 7 p.m. at North Ridgeville City Hall, 7307 Avon Belden Road, North Ridgeville.

Agents will be on-site to answer questions and assist with RITA municipal income tax return preparation. To receive assistance bring with you all necessary tax documentation, including the following: Social Security Numbers for yourself and your spouse; W2s from all employers and Form 1099s; Federal Schedules C, E, & F, Federal forms K-1, 2106, 3903, & 1040 (if applicable); and addresses and dates for each location in which you resided during 2014.

Avon Safety Town: Online registration for Safety Town begins March 2. Sponsored by the Avon Parks & Recreation Department and the Avon Police Department, the program is designed for children entering Kindergarten.
